#### The Context

- Levels of inactivity- particularly in some of the more deprived areas of the UK
- 'Reach' of traditional leisure facilities who is actually using them?
- Ageing assets
- Reducing budgets in LAs
- Revenue sustainability

#### The Opportunity

- Need to attract more diverse usage of leisure facilities
- Need for more efficient use of all LA built assets
- Using other services/provision e.g. education, health to attract people to buildings where physical activity/sport/leisure is also provided
- Physical activity/sport/leisure used as a catalyst to regenerate areas and drive new partnerships
- Co-location/One Public Estate

#### Delivering a different facility approach - what is needed?

- Robust evidence of need for the area, including physical activity/sport/leisure
- Shared strategic outcomes
- A 'can do'/'why not' attitude and the ability to see things differently
- The right partners round the table LA, local partners, external funders, operators,
- The right people on the team
- Resources people, funding, time,

#### Delivering a different facility approach – how to achieve this?

- Develop local insight this takes time and effort to get to those who are often left out
- Hear what local people are saying
- Reflect insight in design
- Put people at the heart of the project and facility
- Focus on accessibility, affordability and sustainability
- Manage it to achieve identified outcomes link to specification and contract

### **Nuneaton and Bedworth Physical Activity Hub**

- 8 lane, 25m pool (1m to 2m deep)
- 13 x7m Learner Pool with moveable floor
- 4 Court Sports Hall with associated stores
- 100 station Fitness Suite
- Group exercise studio 30 person
- Group cycling studio 36 bikes
- Café with views into the pool hall
- Outdoors 9 v 9 all-weather pitch, mountain bike trails, Learn to Ride facility, various spaces for outdoor activity, skate park
- Park-based active environment
